

- Legal scholars generally deal with Roman law as the basis of modern European law, whereas rabbinic law is studied in the context of Jewish Studies.
- Rabbinic civil law, evident in the **Bavot tractates** of the **Talmud Yerushalmi** constitutes a significant Middle Eastern corpus of ancient civil law.
- Ancient rabbis were legal adjudicators who devised rules and precedents in areas of civil law that have analogies, especially in Hellenistic and Roman law.
- > Aims of our project:
 - > analysis and comparison of rabbinic with Hellenistic and Roman civil law
 - > examination of the **impact of Roman law on the eastern provinces** and the development of a **legal hybridity** in Near Middle Eastern societies.
 - integration of Jewish civil law within ancient legal history
