

The Philipps University of Marburg, Faculty of Medicine and the University Hospital Giessen and Marburg GmbH, Marburg site, Department of Psychiatry and Psychotherapy is seeking to fill the following position at the earliest possible date

Professorship (W2) for Experimental Psychiatry and Psychotherapy

The professorship represents the subject in research and teaching. The research focus of the professorship is in the field of Experimental Psychiatry and Psychotherapy in the newly approved LOEWE Center "The Dynamic Network Approach of Mental Health to Stimulate Innovations for Interventions and Changes (DYNAMIC)", either in the field of systemic/cognitive or molecular neuroscience. The post holder will also undertake patient care duties as a physician in the Department of Psychiatry and Psychotherapy.

The applicant is expected to have an internationally recognized scientific profile in the field of research into psychiatric disorders. He or she should be integrated into the interdisciplinary focus "Neurosciences" of the department and the university. Networking with the neuroscientific research networks of the Department of Medicine (FOR 2107, SFB/TRR 135, IRTG 1901, ERA-Net Neuron ResilNet) and the interdisciplinary neurosciences of the University under the umbrella of the Center for Mind, Brain and Behavior (CMBB) with the Departments of Psychology, Medicine, Mathematics, Computer Science and Physics is expected. Networking with the other key research areas of the Department of Medicine in the fields of infection and immunity as well as oncology is also desired.

Applicants should be involved in the curricular teaching of medicine and dentistry and in the teaching of the Master's degree courses in neuroscience at the Faculty of Medicine.

Recruitment requirements are a degree in medicine, a license to practice medicine, a completed or commenced specialist training in „psychiatry and psychotherapy“ and a habilitation or equivalent academic achievements.

The Universities of Giessen and Marburg have established a research alliance in cooperation with the Technische Hochschule Mittelhessen (Research Campus of Central Hessen). Within this alliance, the two medical faculties cooperate in a structured manner on the basis of jointly defined priority areas. Accordingly, applicants are expected to be willing to engage in collaborative initiatives across universities and departments, and actively participate in joint projects. In particular, multi-site patient-oriented clinical research and participation in joint clinical studies are considered essential to the role.

The recruitment requirements of §§ 67 and 68 HHG apply.

The professorship is a research professorship for a period of 6 years with part-time patient care (8 hours/week), after which 20 hours/week patient care are possible. Remuneration for services in patient care is provided by a separate employment contract with the hospital (UKGM).

Philipps-Universität attaches great importance to the intensive supervision of students and doctoral candidates and expects the applicant to have a strong presence at the university, a high level of commitment in the field of academic teaching and intensive involvement in the planned further development of medical training.

We support women and expressly encourage applications from female candidates. Applications from candidates with children are welcomed - the University of Marburg is committed to the goal of being a family-friendly university. Persons with disabilities as defined under SGB (Social Security Act) IX (§ 2 Para. 2, 3) will be considered preferentially in the case of equal suitability and aptitude.
