Professorship/Chair (W3 salary band) in Anaesthesiology and Surgical Intensive Care Medicine

to commence in the summer semester 2025.

The professorship represents the field of anaesthesiology in research, teaching, and patient care. Clinical responsibilities include anaesthesia, intensive care medicine, and pain medicine. In addition to the clinical remit, the successful candidate should avail of outstanding organisational and leadership skills and the ability to combine excellent quality in medical care with efficient processes and an economic use of resources. The clinic focuses on the areas of anaesthesia, regional anaesthesia, inpatient and outpatient pain therapy, sepsis therapy and surgical intensive care medicine. New digital concepts in clinical and outpatient care are expressly desired.

We are seeking an internationally recognized researcher with a track record of excellent publications and successful acquisition of third-party funding. The position holder is expected to actively contribute to the research priorities of the School of Medicine, in particular infection, inflammation, and immunity. Cooperation with the ongoing collaborative projects (SFB1021, GRK2573) and the German Centers for Infection Research (DZIF) and Lung Research (DZL) is expressly desired.

The post holder is expected to build on and further develop innovative teaching concepts (including curriculum development; interdisciplinary teaching; concepts for implementing the National Competence-Based Learning Objectives Catalogue for Medicine (NKLM); hybrid lectures).

The Universities of Gießen and Marburg have established a research alliance in cooperation with the Technische Hochschule Mittelhessen (Research Campus of Central Hessen). Within this alliance, the two medical faculties cooperate in a structured manner on the basis of jointly defined priority areas. Accordingly, applicants are expected to be willing to enagage in collaborative initiatives across universities and departments, and actively participate in joint projects. In particular, multi-site patient-oriented clinical research and participation in joint clinical studies are considered essential to the role.

The recruitment requirements of §§ 67 and 68 HessHG (Higher Education Act of the State of Hesse) apply. Prerequisites for appointment are a completed university degree, didactic aptitude, a doctorallevel qualification, and further scientific achievements, evidenced by the completion of a habilitation or equivalent academic qualifications, or demonstrated in the context of a Junior Professorship. Proof of completed specialist training in anaesthesiology and (specialty) intensive care medicine must be submitted with the application.

Responsibilities in patient care associated with the professorship will be regulated via a chief physician contract to be concluded with the UKGM GmbH. This will be based on the principles of performance-related remuneration, comprising both fixed and flexible components.

The University of Marburg attaches great importance to the intensive supervision of students and doctoral candidates and expects lecturers to show a strong presence at the university, a high level of commitment in academic teaching, and close involvement in the planned further development of medical education. In particular, participation in programmes to support early career researchers at the School of Medicine, e.g. the Clinician Scientist Program SUCCESS, is expected.
