

Criteria for awarding scholarships to support the completion of a doctorate

- 1. Fulfilment of the formal criteria, including acceptance as a doctoral candidate at Philipps University and membership of MARA;
- 2. Proof of high academic quality;
- 3. Max. six months until submission of the written work (dissertation) from the start of funding; as well as a stringent and conclusive explanation that the work can be submitted at the end of the funding period;
- 4. Assessment of the applicant, the research project, the integration into the current research of the working group/professorship and confirmation that no other financial resources are available to support the completion of the dissertation in the first supervisor's report; as well as the consistency of the information (in particular the timetable) in the report and application;
- 5. Social criteria (children/single parents, severe disability, chronic illness, first-time academics, etc.);
- 6. Complete list of publications:
 - In the case of cumulative doctorates, the publications that are part of the dissertation work must be labelled.
 - Furthermore, the other publications relevant to the topic of the doctorate must be labelled.
 - Submitted and accepted (citable) publications may also be listed with a corresponding reference. Publications that are in progress or in preparation will not be accepted.
